



## Practical first experiences on 4 different mink farms (2014).

### Farm 1:

- Spray (Smell OK) in wet nests because of diarrhoea, after 2 days most of the nests are dry.
- Less smell. When they put mats in the cages there was more dung in the cage and the smell came back.
- Wounds heal remarkably quick.
- Much less problems with Footrot.

### Farm 2:

- Hardly any problems with wet nests, with the group with spraying as well as with the group without spraying.

### Farm 3:

- Started spraying (AHS) in 1 shed where the wounded and bad animals were housed. De wounds heal very quick and almost no losses anymore.
- After this also started with the healthy/normal animals. Also here much less mortality.

### Farm 4:

- Clearly lower mortality when spraying (AHS).
- The fur is much softer.
